







INAP's Efforts to address the ARD Challenge

Facilitates the development and maintenance of globally-recognized, authoritative technical guides, such as:

- GARD Guide (www.gardguide.com)
 - "An international guide for facilitating world-wide best practice in prediction, control, and mitigation of acid rock drainage."
 - "The guide is becoming a reference document for all stakeholders involved in ARD and waste management issues."
- Global Cover Systems Design Technical Document
 - Guidance Document, that is not a Prescriptive Approach and is consistent with GARD Guide
 - Provides a "Decision Tool" Approach
 - Links the theory with practice with site-specifics across all aspects







ICARD 2018 Conference

- 3 short courses, 75 attendees total
 - Water Management for Mine Closure
 - Modelling of Pit Lakes
 - Mine Water Management and Treatment
- 331 delegates from 34 different countries
 - 145 (45%) from South Africa
 - Canada (31), Australia (24), USA (19)
- 3-day technical program
 - Plenary sessions each morning
 - Over 150 presentations
 - ➢ 25 posters
- Trade show with 11 exhibitors




